### Travelwise Update

The Travelwise team has been working on a solution to reduce the number of cars bringing children to school. Parents have also been doing unnecessary ‘U’ turns and types of parking that are not practical. To try and change this behavior, we are encouraging the parents of students here at Marlborough to park in other streets, and walk with their child in to school, using the paths. There are paths leading from Archers Road, Chartwell Ave and Wykeham Place.

During Weeks 2 and 3, the children will be given a ‘clip card’ and when they have a complete card, they will be invited to have a Milo drink and a cookie, on Thursday 9 August from 8:15am onwards. Children will be given details about this in class/assembly.

### PB4L Focus

PB4L continues to grow at Marlborough. This is a programme that focuses on directly teaching appropriate behavior and rewarding good choices. We begin each school week with an assembly discussing our weekly focus, and then the teachers follow up in class and in the playground. Your child will have a reward chart in their classroom and students achieve blue, silver and gold certificates. So far, over 200 children have achieved the blue level, with many more moving
