Positive Behaviour for Learning (PB4L)

Marlborough Primary School continues to be a proud PB4L school, teaching our expectations of : Respect Myself, respect People and Respect Surroundings, through in-class teaching and weekly assemblies. Students are directly taught behavioural expectations in different settings, for example, how to treat books in the library, where to play at break times, or how to resolve conflicts with friends.

We reward positive behaviours through a whole-school reward system where students earn certificates for 10, 20, 40, 80 or 100 stamps or stickers. It would be fabulous for whanau to follow through on these lessons at home and discuss what 'respect' means to your family and culture. Teaching (and then reteaching) your expectations will allow the child to fully understand how they ought to behave.

Little rewards (these can be totally free) will help to focus on the positives and decrease those negative behaviours.

Our teaching at the moment has surrounded greeting adults respectfully. Encourage your child to greet their teachers and peers with eye-contact and their name. This helps make MPS such a lovely place to work and learn.
