Dear Parents and Caregivers

Intermediate Schools

2021—2022 New Enrolments

We are currently working on the staffing for the remainder of 2021 and would appreciate if you could let us know if you have a child/children intending to start with us before the end of this year, or have a child who will be starting here in 2022.

Enrolment forms are available on our website or from the foyer in admin block. Please be aware that we now have an Enrolment scheme, which means that if you do not live in our school zone, you will need to apply for an Out-of-Zone Enrolment place. There are specific timeframes for Out-of-Zone enrolments that you have to apply within - ask the Office Manager for details or you can look on our website.

School Uniform

Please remember that we have a school uniform that we are proud of, and expect everyone to wear it with pride. Please make sure that all items are named, - just incase they get mislaid (that way items can be returned to their rightful owner).

Picking Up from School On Time

Please ensure you are on time to collect your child/ren from school at <u>3:00pm.</u> After this time the teachers are involved in meetings, planning and organization for the next day. If you are running late, please phone the Office and we can let your child know, so they won't worry.

Sick Children

If your child has a vomiting bug, please keep them away from school until at least 24 hours after the last vomiting episode. This bug spreads very quickly through out the school. Thank you. With the increase in the number of colds, coughs, sniffles etc, please keep your sick child at home, where it is warm and dry, in order for them to recover fully, as at school we have no facilities to deal with sick children.

The sickbay tends to be used for instant remedies (ice packs, plasters etc) and a place where children wait for quick collection by their parents.

If your child is unwell over night, please phone the office to report their absence for the day. Thank you.
