- 3. If the problem has been raised and not solved in a timely manner talk to Mrs Wotton, DP.
- 4. Give her time to solve the problem.
- 5. If the problem still persists, then make an appointment to see me.

Just a reminder that all staff have an email address and you should use this or Seesaw to contact them.

Staff do NOT check their emails during the school day so if you need to contact them regarding your child and it is a today issue it will be better to contact the office. This is for example when hometime arrangements change.




DROWNING PREVENTION

MARLBOROUGH SCOUTS

Scouts have been a part of the Glenfield community since the 1950s. Mayfield Scouts was established in 1996 following the merger of 2 local, Scout Groups. Mayfield Scouts is part of New Zealand's biggest mixed youth organisation, Scouts Aotearoa.

Unfortunately, a massive slip took away a large portion of the Myfield Scouts site as a result of the devastating rainfall on Friday the 27th of January, 2023. The site was subsequently yellow-stickered.

As soon as the group went looking for an alternative location for term 1, Marlborough Primary was able to provide access to the school grounds and a classroom so the group may continue this term's program.

The group is incredibly grateful that MPS has been able to allow them to continue to provide a programme for their youth while the Mayfield Scout Hall and site are repaired and made safe.

The group is run by volunteers and has sections for youth aged 5 - 14 years old, and each section meets once a week during the school term.


